who meet the following criteria:
18+ years of age;
live in the GTA;
working knowledge of English;
basic computer skills;
interest/previous experience in the food
service and hospitality sector.

When are classes?

Classes & training opportunities throughout the week; ongoing registration.


How much does it cost? Free

A mask is required while on the premises.

What supports/training are available?

- Food and hospitality skills training;
- Customized hands-on learning activities in café management, events management, catering, cooking, baking, office administration, and social entrepreneurship;
- In-house placement in social enterprises (i.e., café, community kitchen, reception, art gallery, and events space);
- Career exploration, goal setting, job coaching, and resume building;
- Job searching and interviewing skills in the Canadian Workplace;
- Foundational supports (e.g., life skills, financial literacy, nutritional counseling);
- Personal supports (e.g., service navigation, housing support, and referrals);
- Personal and professional communication skills.

Participants will be paid \$200 upon course completion (to include transportation costs).
