



Connect to Wi-Fi

- Wi-Fi: the internet (in your home, at a café, etc.) that you connect to with your device(s).
- •This is the universal Wi-Fi symbol:



 Look for this symbol on your device to indicate that you are connected to a Wi-Fi network:








Connect to Wi-Fi Example with iPhone/iPad:

- Open Settings
- Select "Wi-Fi"
- Make sure Wi-Fi is turned on (green oval in photo)
- A list of available networks will appear
- Select the network you want to connect to
- Enter the password (if it has one)
- Select "Join"
- Once connected, the Wi-Fi symbol will appear at the top right hand corner of your screen












Connect to Wi-Fi

Example with Android phone/tablet:

- Open Settings
- Select Connections or Network & Internet
- Select Wi-Fi, and make sure it is turned on (green circle in photo)
- •A list of available networks will appear
- Select the network you want to connect to
- •Enter the password (if it has one)
- Select "Connect"
- Once connected, the Wi-Fi symbol will appear at the top right hand corner of your screen

Press the power button to turn the laptop on











Navigating the search bar in Windows 10







- Sending or receiving an email





Connect to a public W-Fi network & access the internet

- You may want to connect to Wi-Fi when you are in a public space such as the mall, at a restaurant or café or the library.
- The Wi-Fi in these places is known as a public Wi-Fi network.
- Once you have connected to the public Wi-Fi network, you can access the internet the same way you would if you were connected to your home network, such as:
- Through an internet browser (e.g. Internet Explorer, Safari, or Google Chrome)
- When using an application like Facebook or WhatsApp
- Sending or receiving an email










Example: Connect to Starbucks W-Fi network on a smart phone












Example: Connect to Starbucks W-Fi network on a laptop












Example: Connect to public library W-Fi network on a smart phone












Example: Connect to public library W-Fi network on a laptop











PASSWORDS

- Tips for creating a password:
- Use a combination of lowercase and uppercase letters, numbers, and symbols
- Use numbers or symbols to replace letters in a word or phrase (example: 5mile instead of 5mile)
- Do not use personal information like your birthday, name or similar information for your loved ones
- Try not to use the same password twice
- Example of strong passwords:
- ○!Love3MyPiano
- o jelly22fi\$h







PASSWORDS

- Tips for keeping your passwords safe:
- Write them down (on a piece of paper, in a journal, etc.) and keep it somewhere safe.
- Keep them in a Word document,
 spreadsheet or in a notes application on your device.
- Safest option: Download a reliable password storage application on your phone, tablet or laptop. Examples: 1Password, LastPass, Keeper
